

Project Highlights

Why now?

- Our existing ministry center is operating at capacity, with no margin for additional churches to send teams, particularly during the summer months.
- We want to provide ongoing training for the pastors that we work with. This facility will allow us to host pastors and their elders/deacons for transformation equipping.



- We want to encourage more doctors from the U.S. to stay with us for weeks or months at a time. The new guest apartment will accommodate this.
- Our parking facilities are inadequate. We need more room to park our growing fleet of Suburbans and ministry vehicles.

What will be added:

- Meeting space for up to 60 people for conferences and worship.
 - Full kitchen facilities.
 - Conference room and office for Hermann and staff.
- Second floor sleeping accommodations for 26 people (this brings our combined sleeping accommodations to 50 people).
- Two bedroom, two bath guest apartment for visiting doctors or interns from the U.S. that will sleep up to eight people.
- Additional storage space for medicines.
- Additional, more efficient parking spaces for ministry vehicles.
- Relocated housing for Federico and his family (near the front gate for enhanced security).



We are currently working with about 100 pastors, reaching out through the medical clinics to more than

10,000 people, of which approximately half are non-Christians. Unfortunately, only about 10 percent of

the pastors have really started to see transformation in their communities. Why? Because for so many years, most pastors have simply not been taught how to call for workers

to harvest the fields — fields that are ripe with souls. We believe MMM

is well positioned to come alongside of and help equip them to bear much fruit. Our new ministry training center will help us accomplish this task.





The amazing "God Story" of how Medical Missions Ministries began.

Hermann Alb loves to climb. Whether it's hiking to the top of Agua Volcano or tackling the gravel roads through the mountains of Guatemala in a red Jeep CJ7, rising to new heights has always been exciting for Hermann. Maybe this comes from climbing trees. As a young boy, Hermann loved climbing trees... and then tragedy struck.

When he was 8 years old, Hermann tumbled off a tree, landing on his head. This resulted in a brain injury and loss of consciousness for several days. The doctors told his

mother that it would be a miracle if he lived and if by any chance he did, he would be mentally disabled for the rest of his life. His mother prayed to the Lord, giving him away and asking God to heal him so he could serve God for His glory. The next was asking for food. God had healed him! But how would Hermann serve God? He wouldn't find out until after he finished medical school in 1987.

Hermann's pastor invited him to go with him one weekend to the rural areas of Guatemala to experience a medical mission trip with some others from his church. Twelve people piled into an old

rusty Suburban for the four hour drive to Tamahu. It was a trip that would change his life, for it was here that Medical Missions Ministries ("MMM") began.

The people lived in very rural living conditions, in homes with dirt floors. Many had contracted diseases from poor diets and drinking river water. Hermann and the medical team did what they could do with the limited supplies and vitamins they had brought with them, examining the sick and praying for their spiritual needs.

Hermann was behind the wheel for the fourhour, late night trip back to Guatemala City when a voice boomed from the back seat of the Suburban. God had spoken a prophetic word through one of the team members to Hermann, saying: "My son, my son, I have chosen you as a pioneer. What you have seen today is nothing compared to what you will see; I will bless you and prosper you." Hermann began to weep so much he had to pull the Suburban off the road, be still, absorb and understand the calling. God

Timetable

November 2009—Finalize drawings and obtain building permits.

February 2010—Grade the new land, adding drains, pipes, sewage, electricity, etc.

February 2010—Begin construction of the new wall and new living quarters for Federico.

July 2010—When Federico's new living quarters are completed, demolish his old living quarters and begin construction of the new ministry training center.

March 2011—Add sidewalks and pour concrete for driveways and parking.

April 2011—Purchase appliances and furniture.

May 2011—Dedication Service for new facilities.

June 2011—Begin to host additional U.S. teams for the summer months.

Financial Highlights:

- Medical Missions Ministries is debt-free. We will not start any building that will obligate us to any borrowings.
- The MMM Ministry Team is totally committed to this project. Each ministry team member has made a decision to participate financially.
 - The total cost of the project is \$570,000.
- > We already have \$121,000 in a savings account for this project.
- > One of our partner churches has made a matching challenge grant of \$100,000.
- > We need to raise \$349,000 from our donors by December 31, 2009 so we can begin construction in January of 2010.
- > We would also like to raise \$56,000 to add to our year-end General Fund operating reserves.
- > This results in total funding of \$405,000 (\$349,000 plus \$56,000 equals \$405,000).
